- cash and deposits;
- bonds, investments and securities of fixed value issued or guaranteed by any government or government agency in Canada;
- guaranteed investment certificates or similar financial instruments;
- registered retirement savings plans, registered education savings plans, pension plans or senior management benefit plans that are not self-administered;
- investments in open-ended mutual funds;
- annuities and life insurance policies;
- pension rights;
- support payments.
