Community consultations on proposed civil forfeiture law

The Government of Nunavut is proposing a new law to target crimes like bootlegging and drug dealing in Nunavut.

The new law would allow the Government of Nunavut to obtain a court order to confiscate property that is either the "proceeds" or an "instrument" of illegal activity. For example, this would include cash received from illegal alcohol or drug sales, and vehicles or others tools used for bootlegging, theft or similar illegal acts.

Do you think a civil forfeiture law would be useful in Nunavut? Share your thoughts on the proposed new law.
