A person who discovers an archaeological object or a fossil should report the discovery immediately to the Territorial Archaeologist with the following information:

- Name and contact information of the person who made the discovery;
- The date of the discovery;
- The nature of the object or fossil;
- A description of the site and any artifacts/fossils noted;
- A few photographs of the artifact/fossil and/or site;
- A GPS reading of the location, if possible; and
- Any other relevant information.



A person who discovers an archaeological artifact/fossil shall not touch or remove it from the location where it was found.

Should any archaeological remains be encountered, activity in the area of the find must cease immediately and contact should be made to the Territorial Archaeologist (867) 934-2040 as soon as possible.

These regulations are pursuant to subsection 51 (1) of the *Nunavut Act* and the Nunavut Archaeological and Palaeontological Sites Regulations, protecting archaeological sites, artifacts, and palaeontological sites/fossils.
