PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, S.Nu. 2016, c. 13 COMMUNICABLE DISEASE ORDER (#10)

CANADA NUNAVUT

To: All Licensed Premises as defined in the *Liquor Act* and *Liquor Regulations* operating in all Nunavut communities

All food service establishments operating in all Nunavut communities

- 1. The undersigned has reasonable grounds to believe that:
 - a. A communicable disease exists or may exist or that there is an immediate risk of an outbreak of a communicable disease, specifically novel coronavirus COVID-19;
 - b. This communicable disease presents a risk to public health;
 - c. This order is necessary to prevent, eliminate, remedy, or mitigate the risk to public health.
- 2. On March 20, 2020, the Minister of Health declared a public health emergency in Nunavut due to the risk to public health resulting from novel coronavirus COVID-19, and may extend this declaration every fourteen (14) days for the duration of the public health emergency.
- 3. Based on this declaration, the undersigned has dispensed with the notice provisions in the Public Health Administrative Regulations due to exigent circumstances.
- 4. In this order, "Occupant Limit" means the maximum number of occupants permitted in a Food Service Establishment or Licensed Premises.

Part 1: Food Service Establishments

- 5. Pursuant to paragraph 55 (4) of the *Public Health Act*, the undersigned orders that effective **12:01 am EDT Friday July 30, 2021**:
 - a. All food service establishments in Nunavut may open for on-premises dining, delivery, and take-out service.
 - b. Seating capacity be no greater than seventy-five per cent (75%) of the occupancy load for the food service establishment.

- c. There must be at least two meters (2 m) separation between tables and between persons in line for take-out or counter service.
- d. Food service establishments may establish their own hours for on-premises, take-out and delivery services.

Part 2: Licensed Premises

- 6. Pursuant to paragraph 55 (4) of the *Public Health Act*, the undersigned orders that effective **12:01 am EDT Friday July 30, 2021:**
 - a. That all Licensed Premises may open for regular business hours, subject to any applicable licensing conditions.
 - b. Seating capacity be no greater than seventy-five per cent (75%) of the occupancy load for the licensed premises.
 - c. There must be at least two meters (2 m) separation between tables and between persons in line for take-out, coat check, and bar service.

Part 3: Transitional and Enforcement

- 7. Communicable Disease Order (#9) issued for Nunavut on April 26, 2021 is rescinded and replaced with this Order.
- 8. For certainty, in the event of a conflict between a territory-wide order and any order affecting a specific community or group of communities, the community-specific Order prevails to the extent of the conflict.
- 9. Environmental Health Officers appointed pursuant to the *Public Health Act* and inspectors appointed pursuant to the *Liquor Act* may enter any food service establishment or licensed premises during regular business hours for the purposes of inspecting, monitoring, and advising with respect to compliance with this Order.
- 10. For greater certainty, this Order does not apply to the Iqaluit Beer and Wine Store or any other Liquor Store operated by the Nunavut Liquor and Cannabis Commission.
- 11. Pursuant to paragraph 41(1)(f) of the *Public Health Act*, Environmental Health Officers appointed pursuant to the *Public Health Act*, members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, sheriffs appointed pursuant to the *Judicature Act*, municipal by-law enforcement officers, and inspectors appointed pursuant to the *Liquor Act* are authorized to implement this order, including entering any premises other than a dwelling without a warrant.
- 12. Failure to comply with this Order may be considered a breach of this Order issued under the Act and may result in penalties under the Act, which may include:
 - a. A \$575 fine for individuals; and
 - b. A \$2875 fine for corporations.
- 13. Making a false statement or declaration to any person listed in paragraph 8 shall constitute a breach of this Order.
