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Background: For Nunavut, police reported **192** impaired driving incidents in 2015, a

rate of 520 incidents per 100,000 population. Of the total number of

incidents, **181** were alcohol related and **11** were drug related.

For Canada, police reported 72,039 impaired incidents during the same

period.

Notes:

The data in this article are primarily taken from two data sources: the Uniform Crime Reporting Source (UCR) and the Canadian Health Survey (CCHS).

Data from the UCR represent impaired driving incidents, as defined in the Criminal Code, which are reported to and substantiated by police. The CCHS is a household survey whose driving module was carried out in 2014 among a sample of residents of Ontario, Manitoba, Yukon and Nunavut. Respondents were asked the following question. "In the past 12 months, have you driven a motor vehicle after having two or more drinks in the hour before you drive?, "usually referred to in this article as "driving after drinking."
