

LITERACY CENTRES

Resources for Nunavut Classrooms







What is it?

Literacy centres are places set up in the classroom that provide opportunities for students to work independently or cooperatively with peers on meaningful literacy activities while the teacher works with small groups of students during guided reading and guided writing sessions. The Inuktut Titiqqiriniq literacy centre resources were developed for students in Nunavut. They support teachers in running key guided reading and guided writing sessions.

The following resources can help you set up both permanent and temporary literacy centres in your classroom:

- Card games: These games allow students to practise syllabic, morpheme, and word recognition at a literacy centre in a fun, collaborative way.
- Literacy centre videos: These short videos share a story or information. The videos come with a variety of literacy activities to reinforce literacy skills that students are learning in the classroom.
- Audiobooks and e-books: Inuktut Titiqqiriniq has many audiobooks and e-books available for student use at a listening literacy centre.
- **NNS** (My Journal): Students can use this resource at a journalling or writing centre.
- Other reproducible resources: These activities and worksheets support students as they work on comprehension strategies, word patterns, vocabulary development, and writing practice.

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How can these resources be used in the classroom?

Literacy centres are a core component of a balanced literacy program. They give students the opportunity to practise different literacy strategies while you work with a guided reading or guided writing group. Some of the materials created for literacy centres can also be used for whole-class activities.

Literacy centres can be used to:

- Support individual literacy goals
- Create cooperative learning opportunities
- Engage students in authentic and relevant literacy

activities
