Nunavut Arctic College invites you to consider its course offerings for January 2020!

NAC is happy to announce the following programs for new students in January 2020:

1) Getting Ready for Employment and Training

The G.R.E.A.T program is a 14-week training program designed to prepare students looking to enter the workplace. It focusses on essential skills, computers, personal portfolio development and work readiness. An additional 2-week mentored work experience is also a part of this program.

This class will:

- Strengthen different skills that will help you in the workplace
- Consider and develop your own personal and career goals
- Update your resume, cover letter and practice interview skills
- Learn more about employment opportunities in Nunavut

2) Pre-apprentice for the following trade programs in Rankin Inlet:

- Electrician
- Plumber
- Carpentry
- Oil Heat Systems Technician
- Housing Maintainer

3) Piqusilirivvik in Clyde River.

The deadline for next year's intake is January 31, 2020. Courses that will be offered in the Winter and Spring session include:

- Inuit History
- Survival Skills
- Shelter Building

- Skin Preparation
- Sewing
- Tool Making
- Land travel
- Fishing
- Independent Research
- Hunting Skills
- Visiting Elder Speakers
- Camping during Winter & Spring
- Inuit Traditional Laws.
