

Measures for Sanikiluaq

November 18, 2020

Travel

- Travel to and from the Belcher Islands, including the Hamlet of Sanikiluaq, by any means is restricted to those on medical evacuation flights, flight crews, those on flights which must land in Sanikiluaq due to an emergency, hunters, and people with a letter of authorization from the Chief Public Health Officer.
 - Nunavut Inuit may exercise their hunting rights and leave their home community but must not travel to any other community during this time.

Gatherings

- Masks must be worn in all public places.
- Outdoor gatherings are restricted to five people.
- Indoor gatherings are restricted to a household plus five people.
- Individuals must maintain a distance of 2m from others in public other than members of their immediate household.

Food service and licensed establishments

- Food service establishments may continue to operate for take-out and delivery services.
 - There must be 2m distance between people in line for take-out, and no more than 10 people in a line-up at any given time.
- All licenced premises must close.

Long term care, continuing care and medical boarding homes

 Long term care facilities, continuing care centres and medical boarding homes are closed to visitors.

Education and childcare

- All schools, including Nunavut Arctic College, are restricted to remote learning.
- Childcare centres may remain open for children of essential workers only.

Businesses

- All non-essential for profit and not-for-profit businesses must close.
- The following may continue to operate with social distancing of 2m applied, and limitations of people when social distancing cannot be applied:
 - o Federal, territorial and municipal governments.
 - o Designated Inuit Organizations.
 - Grocery stores.
 - o Pharmacies.
 - Fuel and motor vehicle service stations.
 - The Canada Post corporation.
 - Financial institutions.
 - Air carriers and companies essential for airport operations.
 - Food banks, shelters and child and youth advocacy centres.
 - o Taxis:
 - Taxis must only collect one fare per trip.
 - All passengers must wear masks.
 - Snow clearing service providers.
- All construction projects underway may continue, subject to applicable restrictions.

Licensed practitioners and personal service providers

- Veterinary practitioners and psychologists may provide in-person emergency or urgent care services only.
- Group counselling and support groups are restricted to virtual services.
- Personal service providers such as chiropractors, massage therapists, and hairdressers, must close.

Recreation, leisure and community groups

- Public swimming pools, recreation centres and gyms must close.
- Theatres must close.
- Libraries must close.
- Places of worship are restricted to virtual services or in person services of no more than 5 people.
- All public playgrounds, municipal parks, territorial parks, and territorial park reserves must close.
