## Food recall: Certain no name brand Chicken Burgers due to Salmonella

June 05, 2018 Iqaluit, NU

The Department of Health is warning about a food recall on certain no name brand Chicken Burgers. The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) food safety inspection identified possible *Salmonella* contamination.

Certain 1kg no name brand Chicken Burgers are recalled with a UPC code: 0 60383 16636, outer package code: 2019 FE 06, and Inner package: 0378M.

Recalled products should be thrown out or returned to the location where they were purchased. Food contaminated with *Salmonella* may not look or smell spoiled but can still make you sick. Short-term symptoms can include fever, headache, vomiting, nausea, abdominal cramps and diarrhea. Young children, pregnant women, Elders and people with weakened immune systems may contract serious and sometimes deadly infections. If you think you became sick from consuming a recalled product, call your local health centre.
