PESTICIDE ACT PESTICIDE REGULATIONS

Interpretation

1. (1) In these regulations

"Act" means the Pesticide Act

"applicant" means a person or partnership who applies for a permit;

"permit holder" means the holder of a permit;

"pest control product number" or "PCP No." means the registration number given to a pesticide under the *Pest Control Products Regulations* (Canada);

"Pest Control Products Regulations (Canada)" means the Pest Control Products Regulations (Canada) made under the Pest Control Products Act (Canada);

"pesticide application permit" means a permit required by section 2 of the Act;

"pesticide business permit" means a permit required by section 6 of the Act.

- (2) For the purposes of the Act and these regulations, "pesticide" means a pesticide as defined in the Act, but does not include any substance or mixture of substances within the exempt class of pesticides designated under subsection (3).
- (3) For the purposes of the Act and these regulations, there is an exempt class of pesticides composed of
 - (a) any pesticide classified and labelled as "domestic" under the *Pest Control Products Regulations* (Canada); and
 - (b) any pesticide, other than a pesticide classified and labelled as "restricted" under the *Pest Control Products Regulations* (Canada), that is used
 - (i) as a bactericide in cutting oils and aviation and marine fuels,
 - (ii) in a cleanser, deodoriser, disinfectant or soap,
 - (iii) in a dust control agent,
 - (iv) in a fabric softener,

- (v) as a bactericide or algaecide for use in a swimming pool, domestic water supply, industrial cooling system, home aquarium or ornamental pool, or
- (vi) as a surfactant, preservative or adjuvant.

Pesticide Application Permit

- 2. An applicant for a pesticide application permit shall submit an application in Form 1 to an inspector including
 - (a) a map of the geographical area over which the pesticide will be applied that, in the opinion of an inspector, clearly shows the specific places where the pesticide will be applied;
 - (b) a summary of the proposed pesticide application that explains
 - (i) the purpose for applying the pesticide,
 - (ii) the name and pest control product number of the pesticide,
 - (iii) the total quantity of pesticide to be applied,
 - (iv) the application rate of the pesticide,
 - (v) the proposed number and frequency of applications of the pesticide,
 - (vi) the type of equipment and proposed method for applying the pesticide, and
 - (vii) the proposed method for disposing of surplus pesticide and pesticide containers;
 - (c) proof of payment of any assessment payable by the applicant under the *Workers' Compensation Act*; and
 - (d) any other relevant information that the inspector may require.
- 3. (1) Subject to this section, an inspector may issue a pesticide application permit, in Form 2, to an applicant who submits a completed application for it.
 - (2) Before issuing a pesticide application permit, an inspector may require the applicant or any person who will apply the pesticide
 - to establish that the applicant and any person who will apply the pesticide are qualified to safely use, apply, handle and dispose of any pesticide that is to be applied;
 - (b) to undertake to exercise reasonable care while handling, applying, storing or disposing of the pesticide;
 - (c) to complete a course of training, acceptable to the inspector, respecting pesticides;
 - (d) to prove that the applicant and any person who will apply the pesticide are

- insured for public liability arising from the application of a pesticide in an amount not less than \$1,000,000;
- (e) to undertake to notify the public of the time and place of the proposed application of the pesticide by a method satisfactory to the inspector; and
- (f) where the pesticide is to be applied by an aircraft, to prove that the person who will be applying the pesticide holds a valid commercial pilot's licence and that the air carrier is licensed as a Class 7 specialty commercial air service licence for aerial application and distribution within the meaning of the *Air Carrier Regulations* (Canada) made pursuant to the *Aeronautics Act* (Canada).
- (3) When issuing a pesticide application permit, an inspector may, by endorsement on the permit, limit the geographical area over which the pesticide may be applied.

Pesticide Business Permit

- **4.** An applicant for a pesticide business permit shall submit an application in Form 3 to an inspector including
 - (a) a description of the premises where any pesticides will be stored;
 - (b) a description of the applicant's proposed method of storing any pesticides;
 - (c) the name, pest control product number and quantity of any pesticides that the applicant proposes to store;
 - (d) a certificate of good standing issued by the Registrar of Companies and dated within one month of the date of the application, where the applicant is a corporation;
 - (e) proof of payment of any assessment payable by the applicant under the *Worker's Compensation Act*; and
 - (f) any other relevant information that the inspector may require.
- 5. (1) Subject to this section, an inspector may issue a pesticide business permit, in Form 4, to an applicant who submits a completed application for it.
 - (2) Before issuing a pesticide business permit, an inspector may require the applicant and any person employed by the applicant
 - (a) to establish that they are qualified to safely use, apply, handle and dispose of pesticides;
 - (b) to undertake to exercise reasonable care while handling, applying, storing or disposing of a pesticide;
 - (c) to complete a course of training, acceptable to the inspector, respecting pesticides; and

(d) to prove that they are insured for public liability arising from the business in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.

General Terms and Conditions

- **6.** Before issuing a permit, an inspector may require the applicant to undertake, with respect to any pesticide under his or her control, to store the pesticide in a place that
 - (a) is inaccessible to the public and is locked when the person who owns or is responsible for the pesticide is not present;
 - (b) does not drain directly or indirectly into a storm or sanitary sewer, water course or open body of water; and
 - (c) is used exclusively for the purpose of storing pesticides or pesticide related equipment.
- **7.** A permit is automatically cancelled where
 - (a) the insurance that a permit holder may be required to carry under these regulations expires or is cancelled; or
 - (b) the permit holder fails to pay any assessment payable by him or her under the *Workers' Compensation Act*;
- **8.** A permit is valid for a period of one year or such lesser period of time as an inspector may endorse on the permit.

Reporting

- **9.** The holder of a pesticide application permit shall notify an inspector appointed under the *Safety Act* of the anticipated date of the application of the pesticide at least seven days in advance of that date.
- **10.** The holder of a permit shall notify, in writing,
 - (a) the local fire department, and
 - (b) the local Health Officer or Medical Health Officer appointed under the *Public Health Act*.

of the location and description of any pesticides under his control.

- 11. (1) The holder of a pesticide application permit shall, after applying a pesticide, report to an inspector any observed lethal or toxic effects that the pesticide has on life other than that which was intended to be controlled.
 - (2) The holder of a pesticide application permit shall submit a report on the application of the pesticide in Form 5 to an inspector within 10 days of the expiry or cancellation of the permit.
 - (3) The holder of a pesticide business permit shall submit a monthly report on his or her operations in Form 6 to an inspector within 10 days of the end of every month during the period for which the permit is valid.
- **12. (1)** The holder of a permit shall, as soon as is reasonably practicable, notify an inspector when a pesticide is
 - (a) lost through fire or theft; or
 - (b) discharged into the environment by a spill or any other occurrence except an application or disposal under a permit.
 - (2) For the purposes of notifying an inspector under subsection (1), a person may telephone
 - (a) where a spill has occurred, the Northwest Territories 24-Hour Spill Report Line at (867) 920-8130; or
 - (b) in any other case, the Pollution Control Division of the Department of Resources, Wildlife and Economic Development at (867) 873-7654.
