



Nunavut (Excluding Kinngait)

September 20, 2021

As of September 20, the following public health measures apply:

Gatherings

- No restrictions on outdoor gatherings.
- Indoor gatherings are restricted to a household plus 15 people.
- Individuals must maintain a distance of 2m from others in public other than members of their immediate household.
- Community halls and conference spaces and within government and Inuit organization facilities, for activities such as weddings or funerals, is restricted to 100 people or 75% capacity, whichever is less.
- All other indoor gatherings outside of dwellings are restricted to 50 people or 50% capacity, whichever is less.

Masks:

- Masks mandatory.

Food service and licensed establishments

- Food service and licensed establishments may open at 75% capacity.
- There must be 2m distance between all people in line and no more than 10 people in line at any given time.

Businesses

- All not-for-profit and for-profit businesses and organizations operating or carrying on business may open for business but must implement social distancing of two (2) metres.
- Any not-for-profit or for-profit business or organization carrying on business that cannot, due to its physical size, maintain the social distancing of 2m must limit the number of customers in the building to 10.
- All construction projects underway may continue, subject to applicable restrictions.
- Masks mandatory for all not-for-profit and for-profit businesses and organizations operating or carrying on business.
- Taxis multiple fares if first customer consents and everyone wears masks.

Licensed practitioners and personal service providers

- Veterinary practitioners and psychologists may open.
- Group counselling and support groups are restricted to 20 people.
- Personal service providers such as chiropractors, massage therapists can open.

Long term care, continuing care and medical boarding homes

- Long term care facilities, continuing care centres and medical boarding homes can have a maximum of 2 visitors from their immediate family, masks are mandatory for visitors over the age of 4.

Recreation, leisure and community groups

- Arenas open to 50 people or 50% capacity, whichever is less, as well as a maximum of 50 spectators
- Recreation centres and gyms open to 25 or 50% capacity. Group sessions limited to 25.
- Public swimming pools open with group sessions limited to 25.
- Theatres open to 75% capacity or 100.
- Libraries, galleries, and museums open to 25 or 50% capacity and group tours limited to 10, masks mandatory.
- Places of worship open to 100 people or 75% capacity
- All public playgrounds, municipal parks, territorial parks, and territorial park - reserves may open.
- Outdoor team sports and indoor team sports are permitted.
