**Topic:** Elementary-Secondary Education Survey for Canada, the Provinces and Territories  
2018/2019  
Released by Statistics Canada – October 15, 2020

**Background:** In the **2018/2019** school year, there were **261** students graduates in Nunavut public schools, an **increase** of **9** or **3.6%** from the **2017/2018** school year.
