

**Topic**                    **Nunavut Age Group Distribution and Average Age by Community**  
 2016 Census  
 Released by Statistics Canada, May 3, 2017

**Background**            According to the 2016 Census, Naujaat, Hall Beach, Igloolik, Coral Harbour and Taloyoak had the highest proportion of children aged 0 to 14. About 4 out of 10 people in these five communities were children aged 14 and under. On the other hand, Grise Fiord, Pangnirtung, Kugluktuk and Kimmirut had the highest proportion of seniors aged 65 and over. Iqaluit had the highest average age at **31.1 years**. Over three quarters of the population of Grise Fiord were between the ages of 15 and 64. Grise Fiord had the highest proportion of this age group in the territory.
